# Miami-based Chemergy selected for California biofuel project

Miami-based Chemergy Inc. has been selected to provide biofuel technology for a \$1.75 million demonstration project in the San Francisco Bay area.

The [California Energy Commission](#) recently approved funding for the project, for Bay Area Biosolids to Energy coalition.

The location is the [Delta Diablo Sanitation District \(DDSD\)](#) treatment plant in Antioch, Calif.

According to a news release from Chemergy, its technology – called HyBrTec – uses unique chemical processes to convert biosolids (sewage) into hydrogen biofuel for use in generating electricity.

[Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory](#) will provide analysis over the 24-month project.

[Kelly Kell](#), public information officer with the California Energy Commission, confirmed that the project is funded and Chemergy was involved.
